<b>Day 01</b>	<b>Airport - Pinnawala - Kandalama</b>
	<p>Meet and assist on arrival at Airport, Transfer from Airport to Pinnawala</p> <p>As you enter the 25 acre coconut property, do not be surprised to witness baby elephants being bottle fed or moving around freely causing absolutely no harm to anyone. It is rightly a sincere sight to observe how these gentle giants - orphaned and sometimes three-legged - are taken care of since 1975 at Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage. Up to date, over 20 calves have been born here, and it is surprising to hear that some of its inmates have even seen their grand children during the past few decades! Watch as they feed at 9:15 am, 1:15 pm &amp; 5:00 pm and take a river bath twice a day at 10:00 am &amp; 2:00 pm respectively for an experience that could never be felt anywhere else on earth!</p> <p>Transfer from Pinnawala to Kandalama, Overnight Stay at Heritage Kandalama</p>
<b>Day 02</b>	<b>Kandalama - Sigiriya - Kandalama</b>
	<p>Breakfast at Heritage Kandalama, Transfer from Kandalama to Sigiriya</p> <p>The 5th century rock citadel of King Kasyapa and World Heritage Site - Sigiriya - doesn't only boasts of ancient Sri Lankan engineering &amp; urban planning supremacy but also acclaims to be one of the finest monuments of art &amp; culture. Step through the gigantic 'Lion Paws' - overlooking the symmetrical royal gardens below - to comprehend the absolute splendor that once dominated this rock fortress. Surrounded by ramparts &amp; moats the Lion Rock - resembling the mythological 'City of Gods' - is coated by frescoes that relate to Gupta style paintings found in Ajanta caves of India. Walk in the shade of an eminent 'mirror wall' embracing the Western face of Sigiriya representing an artistic hundred meters laminated with graffiti. Wander into the well-fabricated museum downstairs for an epic journey of yesteryears to realize how the citadel floated above citizens with the castle, ponds and irrigation systems that pumped water right onto its summit with an ingenious hydraulic system describing a colossal masterpiece of the great king which remained a wonder in Asia for centuries.</p> <p>Transfer from Sigiriya to Kandalama Overnight Stay at Heritage Kandalama</p>
<b>Day 03</b>	<b>Kandalama - Matale - Kandy</b>
	<p>Breakfast at Heritage Kandalama, Transfer from Kandalama to Matale</p> <p>An agricultural zone in the Central Province, Matale seldom drops off the maps due to its remarkable contribution through flagship crops of the island extending from tea, rubber &amp; vegetables to spices. Spearheading the Rebellion back in 1848,</p>

Stop by the side of a spice garden - into which you will be most welcome - and observe the therapeutic values of spices &amp; processes over a refreshing cup of herbal tea! Or spend sometime idling on the hardened streets if you mean a real town adventure filled with voices and colors.</p> <p>Transfer from Matale to Kandy</p> <p>Last ruled by King Sri Wickrama Rajasinghe - before it was brought under the British rule in 1815, Kandy - the World Heritage Site &amp; last royal capital of Sri Lankan kings - crafts an array of culture, history and heritage in the minds of visitors across the globe. Experience an ancient Kandyan legacy engraved around its crown jewel, the temple of the sacred tooth relic of Lord Buddha. A stroll across this small lakeside town - cradled among the misty hills - will feature the Kandy City Centre - bundled with latest and world class brands, bazaar, an arts &amp; crafts centre, as well as a gem museum &amp; lapidary. walk in color as you glide through fresh fruits and vegetables in the Kandy market. Fine tune your evening by stepping to the beat of traditional music &amp; drumming amplified by a cultural show enhancing the rich and vibrant culture of the Wonder of Asia, Sri Lanka.</p> <p>Overnight Stay at Earl'S Regency</p>
<b>Day 04</b>	<b>Kandy - Peradeniya - Kandy</b>
	<p>Breakfast at Earl'S Regency, Transfer from Kandy to Peradeniya</p> <p>First developed as a pleasure garden under royalty and later harmonized by the British, the Royal Botanical Gardens of Peradeniya - today bundled with the most welcoming facilities located just 4 miles off Kandy - is a flourishing national asset in the Wonder of Asia. Walk into this 147 acre bliss of an experience, passing well tended lawns, pavilions &amp; an octagon conservatory to be greeted by the vast expanse of a magnificently landscaped lush green turf which will encourage you for an exhilarating break. Towards the north of the entrance rests a cafeteria that one might come across before stepping into some of the highlights - the orchid house &amp; giant Javan fig tree - of this place which overflow in grace.</p> <p>Transfer from Peradeniya to Kandy, Overnight Stay at Earl'S Regency</p>
<b>Day 05</b>	<b>Kandy - Tea Plantation - Nuwara Eliya</b>

Augmented by an English countryside atmosphere, the city of light - once governed by English &amp; Scottish planters - is still studded with colonial bungalows, hedgerows &amp; one of the finest 18-hole golf courses in the world. A hike through the green grass and red-brick walls should present breathtaking views of a buzzing countryside hamlet. Drive through green valleys of the hill country pierced by endless waterfalls &amp; dotted by tea pluckers draped in bright-colored saris. Or rent a bike for a gentle ride along the banks splashed by the waters of Lake Gregory.</p> <p>Overnight Stay at Heritage Tea Factory</p>
<b>Day 06</b>	<b>Nuwara Eliya - Hakgala - Nuwara Eliya</b>
	<p>Breakfast at Heritage Tea Factory, Transfer from Nuwara Eliya to Hakgala</p> <p>The pleasure garden of Ravana - in the Ramayana epic - Hakgala, today shouts out to all lovers of flowers. It's all warm jackets and gloves that come to play at Hakgala due to its cool temperate climate. Listen to the bells clinging uphill from God Hanuman Temple which proves valid evidence of the epic tale of Rama &amp; Sita. Whether it is the warm April or the cold December, overall Hakgala truly is a bliss for all ages with an extensive variety of roses, orchids and spices.</p> <p>Transfer from Hakgala to Nuwara Eliya, Overnight Stay at Heritage Tea Factory</p>
<b>Day 07</b>	<b>Nuwara Eliya - Kitulgala - Ahungalla</b>
	<p>Breakfast at Heritage Tea Factory, Transfer from Nuwara Eliya to Kitulgala</p> <p>Showered by two monsoons each year, Kitulgala - the destination of 'The Bridge on the River Kwai' - marks an important landmark in many calendars as one of the wettest places in Sri Lanka. If adventure close to Colombo is your pick, then Kitulgala is your bliss! Grab your gear and toss into the wild rapids for a seamless rafting challenge on white water, thundering downstream throwing rafters far &amp; wide. Hop from rock to rock upstream for a mind-blowing waterfall jump that should strain your voice to the core or slide down to the darkest depths of caves haunted by millions of bats. If hardcore adventurism is not for you, then simply trek along the beaten track to admire the immaculate beauty of the wilderness.</p> <p>Transfer from Kitulgala to Ahungalla, Overnight Stay at Heritage Ahungalla</p>

Days 08	<b>Ahungalla - Colombo - Airport</b>
	<p>Breakfast at Heritance Ahungalla, Transfer from Ahungalla to Colombo</p> <p>The throbbing metropolis, Colombo - located in the West - is not only the country's commercial capital, but also the turbine that impels above 50% of the national GDP flanking Colombo's fancy urban development effort. Drive along the clean streets edging the crystal white Race Course - horse racing hub in 1893 &amp; World War II airstrip - furnished today with lavish clothing, food &amp; tea boutiques. Meanwhile, ride to Pettah &amp; tune into the Floating Market - an offbeat shopping experience - or feel the buzz surrounding the upcoming inspiration, the Colombo Port City - an offshore city - featuring parks, commercial complexes &amp; even an F1 track! Head along Baudhaloka Mawatha towards 'Arcade' facing a historic waypost, the Independence Square. Every designer boutique, top-notch cuisine outlet and even the 'walk-over fish tank', have revamped this colonial masterpiece into one of the trendiest shopping and hangout zones in Sri Lanka. Have a chilled beer at the Dutch Hospital while gazing through fancy windows showcasing best fashion, jewelry &amp; handicraft brands. Smell the scent of incense while listening to the chiming bells of Gangarama temple. Or, jazz up to Colombo's night life spiced by night clubs &amp; casinos that borderline its bustle. If you're lucky, head into an exhibition at the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall (BMICH) before swaying your head to an opera or play at Nelum Pokuna that should just drive your day into perfection!</p> <p>Transfer from Colombo to Airport for departure</p>
